




Activity title: "The Ocean, supplier of water"

General goal of the activity: Explain that the Ocean provides us with water, Raise awareness of the need to ensure this water is of good quality

Introduction after throwing the dice and showing the picture: "The Ocean, supplier of water"	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> . Make the participants want to discover a service rendered by the Ocean. . Motivate all the participants. . Make them curious . Encourage questioning in the group 	<p>Welcome! I want to help you discover the benefits that the Ocean brings us. We chanced on this face of the dice bordered with blue. What does it evoke for you? So let's play and see what it's all about.</p>	<p>Get one of the participants to throw the giant dice. Ask the participants about this "beneficial effect" of the Ocean. Start the game of dominoes (a series of identical pictures): cards with a blue border.</p>	Playful Exchange of views	The dice + picture	30 sec
Presentation of the game	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> . Get the participants to discuss the origin of fresh water . Make the participants want to play the game to find the answers 	<p>Do you know how to play dominoes? Let's look at the different steps in the water cycle and see how the Ocean contributes to this great mechanism that allows us to drink water. Thanks to the heat from the sun 16 billion litres of fresh water evaporate every second from the Ocean all around the world, and end up falling back on to the land and sea in the form of rain.</p>	<p>Hand out a domino to each person or group of people (a card with two pictures). Start the game of dominoes by asking for a card with a double "waves-waves" picture. Then comment on the cards when they have all been put down on the table. If the participants put the cards down in a line, move them to make a square, showing a cycle. Show the "Water Cycle" picture and explain it.</p>	Playful	Cards: Waves-Waves Waves-Sun Sun-Cloud Cloud-Rain Rain-River River-Waves + 'Glass of Water' card? + "Water Cycle" poster by Laurent Audouin	5 min

Awareness-raising	. To get the participants to understand that we all have a role to play to ensure the good quality of the water at each step of the Water Cycle.	The water that we drink can be contaminated by our human activities. Micro or macro-pollution. It's up to us to take care not to pollute water by not pouring any old things down our washbasins and sinks (use biodegradable products), by gardening naturally, by consuming produce grown with smaller amounts of pesticides and weed-killers or with none at all. That way, the water that arrives at the sea will be of good quality.	Show the "Human Activities" presentation, point out the human activities that are sources of water pollution, suggest solutions for acting positively. Conclusion		The Ocean plays a key role in the water cycle. Thanks to the water cycle we have fresh water at our disposal that we can drink. Let's make a positive contribution to this cycle!	Explain			30 sec
Openings to the other benefits	. Invite the participants to discover other benefits offered by the Ocean.	Realise that the Ocean also brings us many other benefits for our health!	Show the other posters on display (or other faces of the giant dice) and invite the participants to discover another benefit of the Ocean.	Affective	Posters on display.	30 sec
